Chris Lucido, 20, was born in Illinois and moved to Austin in 2008 when he was 9 years old.

Chris graduated from Vandegrift High School in 2018. While at Vandegrift, Chris was the Manager of the varsity football team for 3 years and the Bat Boy for baseball for 4 years. After high school Chris attended The University of Texas as part of the E4Texas program to get certified as a Personal Care Attendant. He graduated from E4Texas in 2019.



Prior to being accepted into AIM and moving into his apartment, Chris lived with his mom Barb and sister Sarah, who attends Southwestern University. Chris tragically lost his dad Chet in 2012 after a 5-year battle with cancer.

Chris has been working at Home Depot for over 2 /12 years as a Lot Attendant. Happily he was able to transfer from his initial store to one closer to his new apartment when he moved in.

Chris is a huge sports fan with his favorite sports being football and baseball. He is, of course, a UT Longhorn fan after going to UT. He is also a die-hard fan of the Chicago Bears and the Boston Red Sox. Chris is enjoying being a part of AIM's Special Olympics Basketball team the Sparks.

Fast forward to January - when 1 year and over 300 hours later— they unveiled this app to us. Although their class ended last May, they had become invested in the project and decided they wanted to finish the app on their own. The interface they designed is simple and elegant which will make it very user-friendly for our AIMers.

Since none of our AIMers drive, the fact that we can offer them reliable transportation to and from work in Sparky, our minivan, is a vital component of their success. It is, however, a huge task scheduling the numerous drives, especially since AIMers' work schedules can vary week to week.
